Ash/Lilac Borer

A destructive pest to Ash trees.



Hosts: Ash trees (related hybrids) and lilac varieties

Identification/Damage:

Almost perfectly round, pencil-sized holes on trunk and sometimes on limbs. In April, the adult pupa case will be visible, sticking out from exit holes. Multiple branch loss and top die-back can quickly ruin an ash tree's structure and aesthetic value. Damage to lilacs is very minimal and of little concern.

Control Methods:

One preventive application per year in late April or early May. The borers are attracted to weak stressed trees, so it is important to maintain a vigorous, healthy tree with proper watering and fertilizing.
